EXTENSION/4H MILLAGE PROPOSAL**

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Commissioner _____
and supported by Commissioner _____:

WHEREAS the Citizens of Ionia County are receiving valuable services through the Michigan State University Extension/4H and

WHEREAS, the Michigan State University Extension/4H, will require .17 mill to continue present services and meet the future needs of the county citizens, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Ionia County Board of Commissioners, by the authority vested, will place a millage question on the primary election ballot of August 4, 2026.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ballot proposal will read:

NEW MILLAGE TO FUND MSU EXTENSION, 4-H YOUTH PROGRAMS

This millage will allow the County of Ionia, Michigan to levy the constitutional tax rate limitation on general ad valorem taxes of 0.1700 mills to provide funds for the Ionia County MSU Extension, including 4-H.

Shall the limitation upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property for all purposes in one year under the Michigan Constitution be increased for funding operations of MSU Extension services, including 4-H Youth Programs, in Ionia County, and levy for that purpose not more than 0.1700 mill (equal to \$.17 on every \$1,000.00 of taxable value of real and tangible personal property) for a period of four (4) years, 2027 through 2030, inclusive, for the purpose of providing operating funds to Ionia County MSU Extension, including 4-H Programs (approximately \$ 397,281.00 in 2026)?

To the extent required by law, a portion of the millage (may be captured by the downtown development authorities for the cities of Belding, Ionia, and Portland, and the Village of Lyons' and the City of Belding's tax increment finance authorities.

Department Report

IONIA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE Talking Points

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Jail Population: Our inmate population has been holding steady over the last several months. We have been maintaining a population of 90-100.

Building Issue at the Ionia County Sheriff's Office. We had a major issue with the boilers going down when it got super cold outside. We had them replaced and the new ones went down a week later due to manufacturing defects. Those were replaced under warrant. Thank you to Scott and Tom for getting us through this very tough time!

Projects: The state of Michigan and the Feds have pushed through their mandatory encryption requirements for all police radios that regularly transmit LEIN information. Our hand-held radios are 12 years old and will not take the encryptions. Some of our in-car radios can take encryption and they will be converted, however most will not. This project will likely cost upwards of \$300,000. This project is an unfunded mandate pushed by the federal government to the states. All other police agencies in our area already can encrypt their current radios leaving us left. We are actively seeking a body scanner for our jail. We have secured \$75,000.00 in grants to help offset the cost. This will be placed on the next agenda for discussion and consideration for the next board meeting.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE STAFF

Correctional Facility Staffing: With the changes in staffing, we still have 3 open positions, not counting the two being held for budgetary issues of 2020. We have conducted several interviews but have not moved forward with any of these.

Since the last report, Gabriel Colella was let go in the CTO process.

Mental Health: We continue to see a strong need for mental health access in our facility. Jennifer Zimkowski has continued to work in our facility from the Right Door. Our inmates keep her very busy.

Uniform Services Staffing: We are currently down 2 road patrol positions. Since last report, we let go of Officer Jesse Evans during the FTO process and Officer Loghyn Hurst resigned from the agency. We have hired Shawn Bongard, who is currently in the first phase of the FTO process. We have extended a conditional offer of employment to James Watkins. Watkins comes to us with over 4 years of service in the state of Alabama. He has taken the MCOLES transfer course and successfully passed making him licensable in Michigan.

Awards: We held department awards last week. We are pleased to announce that Deputy Chyanne Overbeck received the 2025 Deputy of the Year award. This award is selected and voted on by her peers and supervisors. Deputy Overbeck has really shown a great determination for policing in Ionia County and has been a fantastic addition to the Ionia County Sheriff's Office family!

Deputy Mezei was recognized as leading our agency in calls for service, found on patrol complaints and traffic stops conducted for 2025.

Detective Kasul received two letters of commendation for her outstanding work closing several large cases in the second half of 2025 (noted later in report). The second one was for work done in conjunction with other deputies bringing a kidnapping suspect to justice. Sgt. Whitford and Sgt. Veenstra were also recognized for their contributions in locating the suspect in this case.

Officer Robert Frost was recognized as the top overtime hound in 2025. He worked more than 600 hours overtime last year. It's easy to say he was compensated for his time, but this sacrifice helps the entire agency to make sure that our jail is safe and secure.

Valorie Seward was recognized by the staff as our 2025 Support Person of the year. Seward is responsible for many different things in our office and is credited with keeping the peace, being the go between for our staff and county administration and keeping things running smoothly.

Medical Issues: We are still seeing a large increase in our jail population with major mental health concerns and addiction-related related medical issues. Our medical and mental health staff are working hard to make sure they are being treated and staying healthy.

Vehicle update: We currently are down one vehicle due to an unfortunate meeting with a deer during a pursuit. We are currently waiting for the new replacement that is supposed to be delivered sometime in March.
